Dear Constituents: Thank you to all who voted for me in the May elections, I'm enjoying representing everyone in the ward on the Borough Council, though the financial restrictions being placed on all Councils is beginning to bite with WCBC having to make saving of £40 million over the next 5 years, which is around 1 sixth of the overall budget. I have been elected to several committees in the Council including Employment, Business & Investment, the Partnerships & Collaboration and the Crime & Disorder Scrutiny Committees.

CCTV in Cefn: I'm please the CCTV and recording equipment camera I've pushed for is up and running at the corner of Hill & Well Streets.

Communities First: This was previously a funding agency for Plas Madoc only in our area and is now in the process of widening its scope into the Urban Villages Strategy which will include Cefn 3 which is the bottom of Cefn area meaning community projects in there will be able to access funding once it is up and running hopefully early next year.

Local Schools: I have instigated a plan whereby the 4 schools in our area for this first time will compete against each other in sports and non sporting events, having had meetings with representatives from all four schools, though this is in its infancy at this time is hoped it will grow and allow pupils more interaction between themselves prior to going to secondary school.

I'm working alongside Dave Taylor trying to get maximise resources, facilities and finance for our area hopefully we will start surgeries early in the New Year. If you have any problems you feel I can help you with please contact me as follows:

MESSAGE FROM CLLR DAVE TAYLOR — INDEPENDENT

Dear Residents of Cefn ward, it has been nearly 6 months since you kindly voted for me in the County Council elections as your Independent candidate and a very steep learning curve to my political career which is for the next 5 years. Since being in position it has given me an appreciation of all past and current members of the public who have given up their time to undertake the work for their communities in the Council as the workload is vast, so firstly I must say a big thank you to all the members of the public who undertake work within the community to improve the lives of the population and their areas.

Within WCBC I am sitting on a number of committees which I feel would benefit the ward, these include: Partnership & Collaboration, Employment Business and Investment, Audit, Appointment's committee, Employment Appeals Panel, UV Cluster Steering Group, Residential/Nursing Home Inspection Team as well as attending Council Workshops, Training Days, Full Council and Executive Board meetings, to name but a few, as well as now sitting on the Community Council and I have put myself forward as a Governor for Cefn Mawr school, as well as running the Cefn Mawr PO and shop. Another group where I am actively involved is looking to promote and improve the Wrexham Town centre. Both Derek Wright and I have been vocal in regards to ideas and ways forward to improve the shopping experience and enhance the physical aspects of the town.

My main focus is and has always been brining an economy back into the area. Since the loss of Flexsys and Air Products we have seen a decline in the area's economic prosperity, this can only be addressed by utilising and enhancing on what we already have, i.e Tourism through the World Heritage site and the Conservation and Heritage of our villages. Working with Officers and Councillors a Destination Management Plan to increase tourism has been drafted which highlights the importance of Cefn Mawr to the World Heritage site. The extension to Plas Kynaston Canal is seen as vital to help in the economic prosperity of the area which is backed by Wrexham Councillors as well as Senior Officers at WCBC. A staged plan for the canal extension has been on view during October in all local village halls and comments from the public have been taken on board. But, with funding being slashed to Councils by Government we are now living in an era where less money has to go further with some services having to be reduced/cut in order to ensure essential services continue. We therefore have to work better together as a community to ensure the improvements that we all want/need within the area happen. To attract tourism to the area we have to tidy up the village areas and manage the trees in order to maximise the views across the valley and World Heritage Site. To do this I would like to set up a Village Conservation Group in order to tackle the trees, weeds and rubbish that spoil the area to enhance the heritage and beauty and entice visitors into the villages. As an established group funding would be sought to assist and maximise the change needed to help in the development of a tourist economy for the area. CEFN MAWR THI UPDATE

The first two building refurbishment projects under the Cefn Mawr Townscape Heritage Initiative (THI) Phase 2 are now complete. 20A Well Street and Offa View High Street are both owner occupied residential properties, but both stand in prominent positions in the historic centre of Cefn Mawr, and both will set the standard for future residential refurbishment works within the Conservation Area.

20A Well Street is a relatively small 19th century cottage, just down from the George Edwards Hall and opposite the refurbished former furniture warehouse of 32 Well Street. Previous

alterations had damaged the character of 20A Well Street, but the THI has been able to restore or re-instate all original features including traditional sash windows, traditional door, Cefn sandstone steps and Welsh slate roof. The gable has been




carefully pointed or rendered using lime mortar or render. The early Wrexham (Ruabon) bricks, were cleaned of their peeling paintwork to reveal their original character. Replacement bricks were sourced locally to re-instate the original proportions of the upper window.

Offa View sits on historic High Street, just a stone's throw from the old Cefn Quarry, (the source of the stone for the Pontcysyllte Aqueduct), and makes a fine contribution to the restoration of this old street which was Cefn's original 'high street'. The project has involved

the restoration and re-instatement of original features, including wooden lead-lighted windows, traditional wooden door, Welsh slate roof, and the

re-instatement of an ornate Ruabon brick and terracotta boundary wall. Cast-iron gutters and lime mortar pointing finish the job to high conservation specification.

These two project, despite their relatively small scale, make a contribution to the restoration of Cefn's historic character disproportionate to their size. Currently 'on-site' is a restoration project at Robert's Electrical on Crane Street which will see the creation of two new flats in the empty space above, and the restoration of two separate period shop fronts from photographic evidence. These THI projects were funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund, Cadw, the Welsh Government and Wrexham County Borough Council.
