

Whether you choose to walk the whole trail or a small section, do wear comfortable shoes and be aware that some of the footpaths can be muddy. As a guide to distances the riverside path is approximately 1.5 kilometres or 1 mile. Here are some interesting features to look out for on the way to the important heritage sites.

- 1 High Street, the old main shopping area.
- 2 George Edwards' Hall, founded by J.C. Edward's brother in 1911. Has been a market hall, a cinema and is now a concert venue.
- 3 The Vaults Public House was an outlet of Wrexham's Island Green Brewery.
- 4 The American Hill - named after a shop at the bottom of this hill known as the American Shop. The owner of this shop had gone to America and made a significant sum of money with which she bought the shop.
- 5 Trevor Basin, where the Ellesmere Chester Canal terminated and goods unloaded onto the Pontcysylte Tramway. The Kynaston Canal extension, now filled in and built over continued into the Kynaston estate.
- 6 The Darkie is the local nickname for a tunnel that crosses a stream. It is believed that a brickworks was once based nearby.
- * The path is usually muddy and may be difficult to follow at this point.
- 7 The Ballast - slag heaps.
- 8 Prince's Bridge so called after the Prince of Wales. Its local nickname however is Pont-y-Cuttin as it crosses a railway gorge cut into Cefn Stone.
- 9 Site of Zion Chapel founded by social reformer and preacher, Edward Evans.
- 10 Ebeneezer Chapel
- 11 Rhosymedre Church - built of Cefn Stone.
- 12 Wheatsheaf Co-op, the headquarters of the Cefn and District Co-operative.
- 13 Site of Old Bakery and Dairy.
- 14 Wynnstay Estate Walls - built of Cefn Stone.
- 15 Waterloo Tower - Built to commemorate the famous Napoleonic battle.
- 16 Wynnstay Estate Lodge & Gate House.
- 17 The Old Baptist Chapel next to the Quaker House.
- 18 Ty Mawr Country Park Visitor Centre.
- 19 The River Dee is the source of drinking water for many English towns and is home for salmon and trout and many waterside animals and birds.
- 20 Monsanto Pumphouse - Built to supply water to the chemical works after the canal banks disintegrated in 1947.
- 21 Jefferies Wood - a pleasant semi-natural ancient woodland.

Os ydych yn dewis cerdedd ar hyd y lwybr i gyd neu ddim ond ar hyd rhian fechan ohono, gwisgoch esgidiau cyfforddus a chofwch fod rhai o'r llywbrau troed yn medru bod yn fwydlyd. Fel canllaw i'r pellteredd, mae'r lwybr glan afon tua 1.5 cilomedr neu 1 milltir. Dyma rai nodweddiannau diddorol i gadw llygad am danynt ar y ffyrdd i'r safleoedd treftadaeth o buys.

- 1 Stryd Fawr, yr hen brif ardal siopa.
- 2 Neuadd George Edwards, a sefydlwyd gan fraud J.C. Edwards yn 1911. Bu'n neuadd farchnad, yn sinema, ac erbyn hyn mae'n fan lle cynhereddau.
- 3 Roedd tafarn y Vaults yn un o safleoedd Braeddy Island Green Wrecsam.
- 4 Y Bryn Americanaidd - a enyddi ar ôl siop ar waelod y bryn yma a alwyd yn Siop Americanaidd. Roedd percheneg y siop wedi mynd i America ac wedi gweud ei fforriad yno, a hyn waeth ei galluogi i brynu'r siop yma.
- 5 Basa Trefor, lle roedd Camlas Ellesmere a Chaer yn dod i ben a nwyddau'n cael eu dadluwyd ar Dramffordd Pontcysylte. Roedd estyniad Camlas Kynaston, sydd wedi'i lenwi a'i godi drosto erbyn hyn, yn cario yn ei flaen i Ystad Kynaston.
- 6 The Darkie yw'r llysenw lleol am dunnol sy'n croesi nam. Credir fod yna weithfeydd brycis wedi'u lleoli gerllaw ar un adeg.
- * Mae'r lwybr fel arfer yn fwydlyd ac efallai y bydd hi'n anodd ei ddilyn.
- 7 Balast - tomeni sorod.
- 8 Pont y Twysybog - fe'i gelwir yn hyn am iddi gael ei haenor gan Dywysoyg Cymru. Ei llysenw lleol fodd bynnag yw Pont-y-Cuttin gan ei bod yn croesi ceunant rheilffordd wedi'i dorri i mein i Garreg Cefn.
- 9 Safle Capel Seion a sefydlwyd gan y diwygiwr cymdeithasol a'r pregethwr, Edward Evans.
- 10 Capel Ebeneezer.
- 11 Eglwys Rhosymedre - wedi'i chodi o Garreg Cefn.
- 12 Siop yr Ysgub, pencadlys Siop Gydwethredol Cefn a'r Cyffiniau.
- 13 Safle'r Hen Fecws a Llaethdy.
- 14 Waliau Ystad Wynnstay - wedi'u codi o Garreg Cefn.
- 15 Ti'r Waterloo - codwyd i goffau'r frwydr Napoleonic era.
- 16 Porthdy a Glatws Ystad Wynnstay.
- 17 Hen Gapel y Bedyddwyr wrth ymlym Ty'r Crynwyd.

- 21 Coedwig Jefferies - coetir hynafol lled-naturiol braff.
