CEFN COMMUNITY COUNCIL NEWS AND UPDATES.

PLATSCHEME Cefn Community Council members decided, and are delighted to announce that Council are to fund a playscheme during the Summer and October half term holidays through WCBC, these sessions are free open access provision for ages 5+ and will be held **Monday and Wednesday at Plas Kynaston Park** from 11am-1pm and on a **Friday at Acrefair School Playing Field** from 11am-1pm. Council also agreed to fund detached Youth Work during term time which will commence in September 2017, this is aimed at engaging with the teenagers in our community.

Cefn Community Council have been successful in obtaining a grant for play equipment in Plas Kynaston Park, these funds will be spent on a replacement roundabout which will be installed in early September, as the grant did not cover all costs involved the remaining balance has been paid from Council's reserve fund.

THE ARCH We are pleased to report that the **Plas Kynaston Foundry Arch** circa 1793 which was donated to the Cefn Community from Eastman's (Monsanto) along with one of the two benches donated from the Retired T & G Union Workers are now in situe at the back of the George Edwards Hall, next to The Historical Society's Museum. We are looking for a suitable location in Acrefair for the other bench.

WHAT IS BEHIND THE NAME? Want to know where the name Oxford Street came from? An unveiling

took place recently at Tesco, Cefn Mawr where you can find a Oxford Bomber plane in a presentation box with the information enclosed. Please go and take a look, special thanks go to local historian *Michael Roberts* for his time and effort spent on the research.

Thank you to **Cefn Druids FC** for donating a set of goal posts to the Community Council which have been put at the MUGA ground.

YOUR COMMUNITY NEEDS YOU! Cefn Community Council are looking to commemorate the end of the First World War 1914-18 and the being of remembrance/armistice with a tribute to the service



men and one woman who died during this and subsequent Wars and Conflicts. This would be done as follows: People from the Cefn Communities who know specific details of the people commemorated on the cenotaph family members friends etc. These people should come forward with those details. If there is enough information gathered this would be given to the four primary schools for them to research the individual's family history, war and service records. It is then envisaged a special edition of the Community News would be issued to coincide with November 2018. We believe this will truly bring together all sections of our communities in commemoration of the people who gave their lives for us to live in our present day democracy.

SAFER ROADS FOR CEFN COMMUNITY COUNCIL AREA: An Area meeting was held on Wednesday 5th July between representatives of Cefn Community Council, the WCBC Councilors and Officer to look at the possibility of making the streets in our community council area safer. To this end it is suggested we adopted a general principle of 20 miles per hour on most of our streets and the installation of more zebra/pelican crossings in Cefn, Acrefair and Plas Madoc. However, In order to progress this matter WCBC will need to bid for grant funding from the Wales Government, to progress this matter. If that bid is successful WCBC Officers will consult with the community prior to any works being implemented on site, to ensure they achieve the measures the residents of Cefn Community desire. Cefn Community Council whole heartedly supports this project, and ask that you get involved with the consultation whether you agree or not with these proposals.

The first half of the Fron Male Voice Choir's 70th

finished with a very busy week at the end of July. On the 22nd they sung in the New Vic Theatre at Newcastle-Under-Lyme's amazing theatre in the round. The guest soloist was Caitlin Drake from Rhos. On the 27th they gave a concert at Seion Chapel Froncysyllte. This was the venue for the meeting in 1947 that discussed forming the choir. A poignant concert for Dennis Williams, and Gren Gough, two of the founder members still singing with the Fron today. On the 29th they held a Garden Party at Trevor Hall, home of Louise Parker the choir's President and the venue of "the" wedding that started the choir on their Voices of the Valley CD success. 140 guests attended, choristers, their partners, Vice Presidents and founder members of the choir.

In August the choir usually breaks but the 26 new members recruited in 2016-17 wanted to carry on to catch up on the choir's repertoire. So for summer the choir can be found practicing at Air Products Club from 7pm until 9pm every Monday. Visitors are welcome and if any men fancy giving singing with the Fron a go this would be a good time to give it a try. Choir returns to normal practice on *Monday* 4th and Thursday 7th of September. They will be preparing for a number of concerts to finish off 2017 but the big local concert is at the William Aston Hall on the **11th of November** when they are joined by Aled Wyn Davies, Aled Hall, and Rhys Meirion, soloists in their own right, who are the fabulous Three Welsh Tenors. 

COMMUNITY FACILITIES FUND

Many visitors to the centre will have noticed the huge amount of activity around on site over the last 6 months. This has been down to a £500,000 investment by welsh government to improve the facility here at Plas Madoc. This has involved a new roof, new electrics, a refurbished plant room, brand new fire detection system and repainting of the outside! 

GOD IN THE CAFÉ & THE COMMUNITY CENTRE

One local Christian group is running a different kind of church because they know that God can be found anywhere and not just in a church-building. When the Creator became a part of his creation in the person of Jesus, people could meet him in the market-place as well as the temple.

The Cefn Mawr Christian Fellowship meets in a community centre, the CRNCA Centre beside the Cefn schools - still known to many as "the old canteen". And they "do" church in a café setting and learn about God together through chat, videos, crafts and other activities you might not associate with "church". CaféChurch - from 10.30am on the first Sunday of every month— is open to all and has something for all ages. At a recent CaféChurch gathering there was someone from every decade from 3 - 80+. Families love the crafts and colouring and the special pre-school children's area. The **next** CaféChurch events are on 3rd. September, 1st. October, 5th. November and 3rd. December - you would be very welcome! Cuppas and cakes from 10.15am for the 10.30am start.CaféChurch usually ends around 11.45am - and it's ALL FREE!

Jesus met so many people in informal situations - at a meal table, on a journey, on the beach or amongst the fishing boats of his local community. He loved to be with people - ordinary people - and make Father God known to them using stories and everyday experiences that were easy to understand. In the same spirit, the CMCF (Cefn Mawr Christian Fellowship) seeks to make it easy for people to discover that God loves them and cares for them. That's why they meet as **CaféChurch** and why they recently held two Healing Cafés in the CRNCA Centre, offering prayer in the power of God's Spirit. Several local people found help in their need: help with ill health, bereavement, supporting others who are ill or troubled, and so on. CaféChurch always includes prayer for healing and help: folk can write a need or a name on a "sticky note" and place it on the Prayer Board and as the gathering closes a simple prayer asks God to touch all the people and problems placed there.

The CMCF is hoping to hold another Healing Café on Thursday 16th. November from 7.15pm, probably with an opportunity to remember loved ones who have died and are still grieved for, as well as prayer for other needs. In December it will be time for the popular Community Carol Service, most likely on Thursday 14th at 7.00pm, hopefully with the Ysgol Cefn Mawr Choir. 


YSGOL ACREFAIR NEWS

PKC GROUP UPDATE



Dear Fellow Residents of Cefn Mawr you may have seen mention of the consultation that the Canal & River Trust, Solutia and WCBC are holding regards the ex-Monsanto Site. This to try and gauge what to do with the ex works and now brings the total expenditure to almost £200,000.00 on consultants for so called master planning with nothing achieved. The leading THI work, the Ebenezer with £1.5 million pounds spent on it has remained closed and unviable for the last four years and our community has been segregated from the World Heritage Site despite being at the Centre of the WHS corridor.

The CRT are leading this consultation and if this is left up to them our community will remain isolated and forgotten. They have blinkers on and only think about the canal and about 2mts either side of it!

However this need not be the case and we can rise up and make them aware that Cefn Mawr should be connected to the aqueduct in ways that will work such as Jessop's Tramway, the Windborne Gate Car Park and the Plas Kynaston Canal etc. These things will bring tourism to our community centre and spur employment in Cefn Mawr. The PKC Group will make a case for this as usual but we also urge as many of us possible to do so as well. It is only by making these people aware that our community is here and that it should be included, will it be so. If we don't it will once again be forgotten and left out. WCBC see me as the Demon from Cefn Mawr who points out the truth, and here in is another lesson. WCBC need to start listening to what the people of Cefn Mawr are saying and have been saying for the past 7 years.

The real irony of all this is if the said parties here had worked with the PKC Group as we have asked them to do for the past 7 years JT and the WBG Parking would be open and we would be seeing at least 10% of the tourist count in our village centre. That is 25 to 30 thousand people.

The cost of JT & WBG (that would have been completed by our local people and trades men) is less than has been spent on highly payed consultants from outside our community with nothing achieved so far.

So we ask that you join in and tell them to listen and work with us to reunite Cefn Mawr and the aqueduct so we can start to rebuild the economy of our community.

And if any one would like to join me for a beer at the Holly Bush Inn to talk about this and what practical things can be done you are always welcome.
