News Update

Welcome to the third edition of Crane News.

Since the last edition we have continued unabated with the delivery of our Covid -19 safe vaccination clinics. The vaccination programme has definitely been an immensely challenging time but we remain committed to ensuring all of our patients are offered and ultimately receive both their vaccinations to give maximum protection against contracting the virus. As we are now fully immersed in delivering our phase two plan of second doses we still remain committed and encouraging of those patients who are still undecided about being vaccinated.

With this in mind please contact the surgery for your vaccine if you have not yet received one or both and we will assist you in securing that all important vaccination. We are fully aware that there have been concerns raised in the media regarding the Oxford Astra Zeneca vaccine and an increased risk of developing a potential and rare type of blood clot. Those patients aged between 18-39 years will receive the Pfizer vaccines unless contraindicated. We are all now working to the latest published guidance where those aged forty or over will receive the Astra Zeneca vaccination. So if you are under forty and received your first dose of Astra Zeneca then it is important that you receive your second dose as planned. The second dose importantly gives the higher, longer lasting protection and is notably associated with less frequent minor side effects like mild headache. Very rare adverse effects are thought to be associated with first doses only.

In the interim as "normal" life begins to re—awaken from the pandemic slumber we still wish to highlight that we remain here for our vulnerable patient groups with chronic diseases and would encourage anyone with symptoms suspicious of serious illness including those with mental health difficulties to contact us. In addition we would urge all seventy to eighty year old patients to book their Shingles vaccination if they have not yet received one. We would also encourage all those aged 18-25 years to book their MenAcwy vaccination to protect them from meningitis if they have not already received this vaccine.

Last month we were also delighted to extend a very warm welcome to our local MP for Clwyd South **Simon Baynes** who visited us on the 7th May. During the visit, Mr Baynes thanked staff for their tireless work on behalf of residents and the local community and discussed in particular our successful work in delivering the Covid-19 vaccination programme. As a practice it has always been our number one priority and pleasure to be serving the health needs of our patients and the local community. The Covid pandemic has merely reinforced our

commitment to ensuring that we play our part in vaccinating and protecting as many of them as we can.

"As a practice we would like to thank all those patients who have come forward and received their vaccinations and for all your kind and positive comments on the organisation and delivery of the clinics both at Crane Medical Centre and at the local vaccination centre at Plas Madoc Leisure Centre.

"Our final comment would be to urge those who have not as yet been vaccinated to come forward. Together we will triumph over adversity and forge a "new" tomorrow – until then please continue to adhere to government guidelines for yours and everyone else's safety."

At present the practice continues with our clinical triaging of all telephone calls before our clinicians are able to see you face to face. Please do not attend the surgery if you are experiencing/suffering with a high temperature, a new and continuous cough or loss of taste/smell. 

We celebrated our belated St. David's Day, by wearing Welsh costume, listening to stories and enjoying some Welsh food. We had such a fun day! The children in Year 2 have been

learning about staying safe when playing out, with PC Kim. They have also thoroughly enjoyed finding out about and playing with the Victorian toys as part of their learning about the past.



Year 4 have explored the magic of metamorphosis! Our teacher surprised us with some tiny caterpillars, and we used our mathematical skills to see how many centimetres they would grow every few days. We estimated, then measured them carefully, which was tricky as they were quite wriggly!

Next, we examined the lifecycle of a butterfly and the stages it goes through to become a butterfly. When they turned into chrysalides we carefully observed them, until we could see their wings through the chrysalis!









Then, we labelled the parts of a butterfly and found out how they sip nectar. We also discovered some more amazing facts about our butterflies- they migrate all the way to Africa in the winter! Finally, we set our butterflies free to continue with their lifecycle, it was wonderful!

When we re-open we will have some new exhibitions for everyone to see. We are hoping to have new displays about churches, transport, mills, farming and geology. MOBILE TESTING AT WREXHAM INDUSTRIAL ESTATE

A mobile testing unit has opened on Wrexham Industrial Estate to make it easier for people working there to get a Covid-19 test. The move is part of ongoing work to help keep virus cases low in Wrexham. The easy-access testing facility will be offering rapid lateral flow tests at the Redwither Business Park, every Monday based in the overflow carpark adjacent to the staff car park, Staff working on the industrial estate who don't have symptoms are encouraged to get tested at the unit, anyone who does have symptoms should self-isolate immediately and book a PCR test from

www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test About one in three people with coronavirus don't have symptoms, but can still infect others, and getting tested regularly is the only way to know if you have the virus. If people test positive and self-isolate, it helps stop the virus spreading. The work is being co-ordinated by Betsi Cadwaladr University Health Board, Wrexham Council and Welsh Ambulance Services NHS Trust.

NHS 111 was launched in North Wales on Tuesday 22nd June 2021. Patients in North Wales are now able to call 111 for free access to urgent out-of-hours medical care and round-the-clock health support and guidance. Health advice and information can also be found on the NHS **111 Wales** website, which includes online symptom checkers for common complaints and conditions. The easy-to-remember number is free to call from landlines and mobiles and provides access to both GP Out of Hours services and health advice from NHS Wales. It will help patients get the right information, guidance and treatment in the right place at the right time. North Wales is the latest area of the country to roll-out the clinically-led national service. Callers can receive health advice over the phone, be invited to attend a *Minor Injury Unit* or arrange an urgent assessment by an out of hours GP or nurse practitioner depending on their symptoms.



THE DEE VALLEY PICTURESQUE BUS SERVICE

New bus service launched in the Dee Valley providing access to some of the key destinations in this beautiful and historic landscape. The 199 service operates on Saturdays til 30th October 2021. 





DRONES: WHAT YOU NEED TO **FLY LEGALLY**

How to make sure you have what you need to get started flying legally.

ID and Registration Requirements

There are two IDs you may need before flying drones or model aircraft outdoors in the UK:

- flyer ID, which shows you've passed the basic flying test
- operator ID, which must be labelled on your drone or model aircraft

You may need to have both.

FLYER ID

You must pass the CAA's official theory test to get a flyer ID before flying a drone or model aircraft. You're responsible for flying safely and legally whenever you

OPERATOR ID

The operator is the person responsible for managing a drone or model aircraft. This means they're responsible for things like maintaining it and making sure that anyone who flies it has a flyer ID. You must be 18 or over to get an operator ID.

Classes of Drone

The types of flying you do with your drone or model aircraft are known as operations. This affect things like where you can fly, and how close to people and crowds you can fly. Drones and model aircraft are split into 5 Classes, each class has specific rules on where you can fly, whether you need an ID etc. Please ensure you check if your drone has a class mark, if it doesn't, you will have to follow the regulations according to its weight. There are further regulations to follow if you have a camera on your drone also.

IT IS CURRENTLY AGAINST THE LAW TO RIDE AN E-SCOOTER IN ANY PUBLIC PLACE

We understand that buying an e-scooter can be tempting, especially as you can buy them from many popular retailers.

HOWEVER, THE CURRENT LAW IS CLEAR.

You can buy one but you can't ride it on a public road, cycle lane or pavement. E-scooters can only be used on private land with the permission of the landowner.

WHY IS THIS?

E-scooters are classified as Personal Light Electric Vehicles (PLEVs), so they are treated as a motor vehicle and subject to the same legal requirements such as

MOT, Licensing, Tax, Insurance.

As e-scooters don't have number plates, signal ability and don't always have a visible rear light, they can't be used legally on the roads.

WHAT HAPPENS IF I'VE BEEN STOPPED BY NORTH WALES POLICE?



North Wales Police understand the public's support for environmentally friendly modes of transport and want to work with the public to make sure that the roads are safe for everyone. The UK Government is currently taking part in 'Future Transport Zone' trials for e-scooter hire, with a view to making them legal to use on the road. All local

authorities can apply to take part, but at the moment **North Wales are not part** of the trials.

Section 59 of the Police Reform Act allows police to give road users a warning if they are reported to have used their vehicle in a manner which causes alarm,

distress or annoyance. North Wales Police also have the powers to seize vehicles – please make sure you keep e-scooters on private land, with the landowner's permission, to ensure this does not happen to you.

YSGOL ACREFAIR NEWS

What a wet and windy start to the summer term we have had! We have still managed to get outside as much as we can this half term though with lots of classes concentrating on inquiries relating to our natural world and the environment. In Nursery the children have been finding out about how things grow, they have planted grass seeds, cress and beans and have seen how these things all grow in different ways. They have been enjoying reading 'The Hungry Caterpillar'. Year 2 have been exploring the best places for growing their radishes and what factors affect how they grow. The

children in Year 1 have been finding out all about the important role that bees play in our environment. In Year 6 the children's inquiry question was 'how can we use more sustainable practices in our school?' and they have set about establishing allotments as part of their 'leaver's legacy' which the children in other classes will be able to harvest from and use next year. They have planted a range of vegetables, a group who were particularly interested in growing herbs have also established a sensory garden with a range of different herbs. In Year 2 the children have been learning about the ocean and plastic pollution in our seas. Year 5 have also been learning about United Nations Sustainable Development Goal 14 'Life Below Water' and they too have been finding out about the impact that humans have on the ocean. Both classes have produced some beautiful artwork and descriptive writing on this theme.



Whilst we have been learning about the environment, many children have noticed the issue that we have with litter on our school field, and we were very pleased to work with Councillor Benbow-Jones and 'Keep Wales Tidy' to carry out a litter pick on the field and around the school grounds. We collected more than six, bin bags full of rubbish! The children in Year 6 have written a letter to everyone in the local community asking them to take more care of our field. so that it is a safe place for us to use for our learning. We have been equally busy with our children learning inside if the classroom too. The children in Year 3 have turned their attention to the theme of castles this term and are in the process of creating models of different

castles from around Wales, using what they have found out. They have also been enjoying their work on well-being with the different 'well-being monsters' who they have been introduced to this week. In Year 4, the children's inquiry question has related to the impact that war has upon children. They are learning all about out about the evacuees in World

War 2 as part of our focus on 'Goal 16- Peace, justice and strong institutions'. As part of this work, PC Kim came into school to work with all of the children in Years 4, 5 and 6, helping them to understand how the justice system works in our country. The children in Years 5 and 6 have also been learning about the local elections and what it means to be part of a democracy. We are looking forward to next half term and hopefully some sunshine to end the school year too!



PKC GROUP UPDATE JUNE 2021



Dear All, Fortunately, we were successful in our bidding at the auction to retain the Ebenezer for our Community. Unfortunately, it has been extremely difficult to find the finance for such after COVID 19 lockdowns and loss of business for over 50% of the past year. However, my family pitched in, and we have been able to pay WCBC in full and are asking for the keys as our respective solicitors complete the conveyance.

Our general ethos remains the same, the building is to be reinstated as the Flag Ship of the Cefn Mawr Conservation Area at the centre of the Pontcysyllte World Heritage Site, to bring about Economic Regeneration through Sustainable Tourism Development. The name of our campaign remains the same, "Back to the Future for the Cefn & Cefn Mawr".

Please bear in mind that when we say this, this includes all the villages in the central section of the WHS where we live. This will result in increased business activity, greater employment opportunity, and more jobs for our local people.

We and our team at the Holly Bush Inn know that our pub will only do as well as the community around it, so the more we can do for our community the better it will be for our pub, the Holly Bush Inn.

We would like as much community involvement as possible, and we want to hear everyone's input, consultation is important, and everyone should be allowed to have their say. We hold regular PKC Group meetings at the Holly Bush Inn on the second Tuesday of each month and all are welcome. These are informal social gatherings to share ideas between ourselves about what we can do around our area to make things better. Most, if not all the ideas that the PKC Group are involved with have come from these meetings, and everyone's input is welcome. The PKC Group is a think-tank if you like made up of ordinary people with a common aim of improving our community.

As for the Ebenezer there is no set agenda and we are open to ideas and proposals, the only thing we must bear in mind is that it is now up to us to make a go of this. Whatever we do, must be commercially viable at the end of the day, as it will have to stand on its own feet. We have done this with the Holly Bush Inn after years of neglect by the breweries and now intend to do similar with the Ebenezer and hope many of you will be joining us.

At this point we doubt there will be any quick fixes and there is a lot of work required on the Ebenezer to get it up to a suitable standard for a flag ship of our community, again after years of little or no maintenance, since the closure of the building, as we took on the Holly Bush Inn back in 2012/13. We have been through a lot together and still we are going,

and fully intend to get where we need to be, where we are contributing towards a better future for our children and grandchildren. We fully support the Welsh Government with the Future Generations Act 2015 and the drive towards a Circular Economy, Zero Waste and minimal CO2 production. This will be practiced in all we do as in our current business activity. We must take responsibility for our area and actions and be custodians of such to ensure that we leave it in a better condition than we inherited it in. The good news is, we can do this together.
