

News Update



Welcome to the seventh edition of Crane News.

Hello everyone. Hope you have all been keeping safe and well.

As we all attempt to live greener lives by reducing our carbon foot prints, we must ask ourselves what impact if any, does our healthcare provisions have on our endeavours?

Over the last few months for example work has begun on a change from metered dose inhalers (MDI) to dry powder inhalers (DPI) as the former contains gas propellants that are contributing to global warming. However, for certain groups of patients like young children this formulation is not suitable as they require a different inhaler technique to be applied. If needed in an emergency or if the DPI inhaler proves difficult to use you can still obtain a prescription for MDIs. In addition, your local pharmacy can provide you with valuable and important advice on inhaler technique to remove any uncertainty.

Please remember that any used inhaler canisters may still contain levels of these gases and you should not attempt to dispose of them in your general household waste or recycling but rather take them to your local pharmacy with any other used or unused medications where they will be correctly disposed of. Arguably a more beneficial effect on our health and wellbeing than medication is the act of making positive lifestyle changes. Such positive impactful changes can further highlight the immeasurable cost savings for the NHS that can be created.

We all know it can be a very challenging experience trying to change our habits. The key to success is to implement small, measurable changes. If for example you are finding it difficult to get to the gym why not engage in a free **YouTube** workout at home or go for a walk in the local park or countryside. If money is an issue or you simply don't have a clue where to begin then you may be eligible (dependent upon having certain health conditions) for the **Exercise On Referral Scheme**. The free scheme will introduce you to a qualified instructor who will assist and guide you in creating a structured programme allowing you to reach the realistic goals you set for yourself and to make positive changes in your life.

If you want to break the habit of smoking then *Help Me Quit Wales* can provide you with free behavioural support and medication to help you quit for good. They can be contacted on **0800 085 2219**. If you have an issue with alcohol the website/app *Drinkaware* assists users to track their intake and offers tools to help users make better choices. If however more intensive help is required then the local charitable organisation *CAIS* can be contacted who offer support with drug and alcohol issues.

If your diet is of a concern, then the *NHS Food Scanner* app is there to help you. The food barcode scanner puts the scientific nutritional guidance into more user-friendly information and offers healthier alternatives. If, however you are still struggling to bring about a behavioural or healthier life style changes then you can enlist the support of our practice *Social Prescriber*. Social prescribers are trained individuals who are there to support patients and empower them to take control and facilitate positive life changes. The team are based at *The Rainbow Centre* in Penley and can be contacted on telephone **01978 830730**.

ELECTORIAL ARRANGEMENTS FROR WREXHAM

Following the Local
Democracy and Boundary
Commission Review for
Wrexham, the Welsh
Government have made the
following order - The County
Borough of Wrexham (Electoral
Arrangements) Order 2021.
This order is now in force.

The following changes will be made:

- J Increase the number of Borough Councillors from 52 to 56.
-) Increase the number of wards from 47 to 49.

The specific changes to our local wards are as follows:

ACREFAIR NORTH WARD

This is the previous Plas Madoc Ward with Plas Madoc moving into Acrefair and will remain represented by 1 Councillor.

CEFN EAST WARD

This is part of the previous Cefn Ward with Cefn Bychan and part of Rhosymedre forming the new ward and will be represented by 1 councillor.

CEFN WEST WARD

This is part of the previous Cefn Ward with most of Rhosymedre and Acrefair forming the new ward and will be represented by 1 councillor.

Sorry the maps are quite small but to date they are the only ones available.

Please note your Polling Cards will state which ward you are in and where you go to cast your vote.





PSCOs UPDATE

We have received a report of a person cold calling in Plas Madoc, claiming to be from a gas company. The person involved was extremely pushy, did not have any identification, and quickly left the area once



challenged by the resident. A scammer may knock on your door pretending to be a trader, charity collector, or simply in need of help. They may seem polite and friendly, but that doesn't mean you can trust them. Anyone who calls at your door should have some form of identification. You are within your right to ask for this. Never give out banking or personal details to anyone that you are unsure about. If you can't be certain that a visitor is who they say they are, then ask them to come back at a later date, this allows you time to check details or have a friend or relative with you.

Remember its OK to tell visitors that you are not interested or ask them to leave if you aren't comfortable.

Things to remember:

Stop - are you expecting anyone?

Lock - If you aren't expecting anyone, keep any outer doors locked before answering the front door. Consider looking through the window or spy-hole to see who is there first.

Check - Ask for an ID card and examine it carefully. If you are still unsure, never call the number on their I.D card to check them out. Ask the person to wait outside, shut the door and find the company number on the internet or from a bill. If they are genuine, they won't mind if you keep them waiting. If you are being pressured or feel unsafe, contact friends, family or the Police.

Not sure? Don't open the door!





PKC GROUP UPDATE FEBRUARY 2022



Dear All, the red circle here covers our entire area including all wards and villages in the central section of the Pontcysyllte (WHS) World Heritage Site. The circle radius is 2 miles and there are 10,000 of us living in it. We outnumber the combined populations of Chirk and Llangollen (4.5K+4.5K= 9K), and yet we seem to have the poorest of everything. This is wrong and needs correction. Despite the very high visitor count, 330,000 to the aqueduct and 70,000 to Ty Mawr Country Park our community sees very little benefit from WHS status. Our community remains locked in postindustrial depression with one of the highest unemployment rates in NE Wales. Given the high visitor counts we should be booming, but sadly again we have by far the poorest economy in the WHS with Chirk and Llangollen streets ahead of us.

The Trevor Basin Master Plan offers our community little and is allocating 1.5

hectares of land for development. This will no doubt result in new business to the area, i.e. retail chains and other national consortiums. These will operate at unfair advantage (with visitor revenue income) to our currently struggling businesses (without visitor revenue income). This will result in <u>further closure of our own local business interests</u> in preference for outside concerns. This will be similar to what happened in Cefn Mawr with the arrival of Tesco.

The Levelling Up Fund, £15 Million Pounds promised for the WHS and £4.5M scheduled for our area. This is good news but what it is going to be spent on? Do we need another visitor centre as we already have one at Trevor Basin, one at Ty Mawr Country Park and if WCBC would work with us, we can reopen the Ebenezer? Do we need a Tree Top Walkway and other nonsense, I don't think so and yet here is £4.5M being spent on it? However, whilst this is going on the B5605 remains closed, for over a year now, damaging our economy further. Our community is subject to almost regular traffic chaos whenever the A483 closes. The B5434 now carries 3 times the heaviest traffic flow ever seen, and the Bont Bridge is slowly being destroyed. Our remaining roads are riddled with potholes and our bus services have been decimated and flooding in our community, that is nowhere near a flood plain. Medical Facilities, 2000 of us signed the petition for a New Medical Centre at the old Co-Op Supermarket Site years ago, but where is it? We are the largest population but still have the poorest medical facilities. Llangollen has a state-of-the-art Medical Facility recently fitted with a new Solar Cell roof on the site of the former Woodlands Night Club. Chirk does even better with their New Medical Facility next to the Hand Hotel and an excellent Community Hospital as well. Well done, Chirk, but unfortunately not well done for us.

Rail Transport, with the coming fuel price hikes and ever rising cost of vehicles, and recently announced bus schedule cutbacks, rail transport will become ever more attractive and viable. Ruabon and Chirk both have railway stations left over from another age (in the wrong places) whilst we could reopen Rhosymedre Halt, at the centre of our community, serving it well. There is a lot more that needs addressing in our community, and I will be posting on Facebook as we go.
