





Three years after divorcing my ex still hasn't paid me my share of the house!

Q. My ex-husband and I were divorced 3 years ago. It was agreed that he would pay me £50,000, and the house would be put in his name, and he would get me off the mortgage. However, I have still not received my money, the house is still in joint names, and I am still on the mortgage. Without the money I cannot buy another house with my new partner, and I am stuck in rented accommodation. What can I do?

A: Without seeing the Court Order that was agreed and approved by the Court it is not possible to provide a definitive answer, but you should have options.

You should be able to apply back to the Court to ask that the order is enforced, and under the Matrimonial Causes Act 1973 you have the ability to ask that the original order is varied to enable the house to be sold if your ex does not comply with the original order. You may also be able to ask the Court to order that your ex-husband pays you interest on the unpaid sum. Given the length of time that has elapsed since the original order was made, that interest will not be an insignificant sum.

If you are left with no option but to apply to the Court, you can also ask the Court to order that your ex-husband be responsible for the legal costs you have incurred and the Court may well order him to pay you some or all of your legal costs.

You should consult with an experienced matrimonial solicitor who will be able to properly advise you on the merits of your specific case and discuss your options in full. It is worth noting that, depending upon your personal circumstances, Legal Aid may be available to you.




LLANGOLLEN MUSEUM NEWS

Our first application for funding to purchase the Museum from Denbighshire County Council, and to replace the roof of the building, will be submitted in about a week,

CEFN COMMUNITY COUNCIL AND NORTH WALES POLICE JOINT STATEMENT ON ANTI SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR (ASB)



Over recent weeks there have been several incidents of ASB in our Community Council Area, this has included the *MUGA* at *Plas Kynaston Lane* being damaged following £25000 being spent on resurfacing it.



The View Point on Cefn Bank had a new dry stone wall and bench installed which Cefn CC worked in Partnership with Our Picturesque Landscape, this

has been damaged numerous times by both graffiti and stones being dismantled and thrown onto Bowens Lane, Hill Street and Queen Street causing significant damage to property and very dangerous situations to residents pedestrians and motorists, how no one has been seriously injured by this is very fortunate to say the least.

At *Ty Mawr* Cefn CC worked with WCBC, Ysgol Cefn Mawr and Ysgol Min y Ddol to plant over 250 sapling trees, many of which have now been torn up and discarded.

There have been many incidents recently of youths driving both motor bikes and electric scooters throughout the community area in an erratic and dangerous manor putting themselves and others around them at risk. There are repeated incidents of motorbike riders and riders of E Scooters in *Plas Madoc* terrorising people, tearing up the football field there and riding around with balaclavas on to prevent being recognised. *Rock Road Rhosymedre* is also seeing repeated reckless driving in the area.

Councillors are elected to serve you, we are doing our best to provide facilities for everyone in our community and want to keep improving services, we can't sustain the level of recent damage being done, if it continues we will have to consider some drastic measures such as closing the MUGA at Plas Kynaston Lane at 4pm every day and on the weekends.

The last thing we want is for any youth to get a criminal record which could blight them for the rest of their lives but feel we have no other choice but to ask all residents to ensure that they report any future ASB incidents to North Wales Police.

"As the inspector of Wrexham Rural I have been made aware of several incidents of Anti Social Behaviour within the communities. In particular Cefn Mawr has seen some incidents which affect the community. I am in full support of the Community Council and the good work they do. My ask is that you help your community to ensure that it is a pleasant place to live. I won't accept behaviour that affects the public in a negative way — criminal damage, public order incidents or anti-social behaviour. I will be putting uniformed officers into Cefn Mawr throughout the evenings and asking that such behaviour is dealt with."

TREVOR BASIN VISITOR CENTRE

We are now open 7days a week 10-4pm. As some visitors have seen, work has begun at Trevor Basin to create the new space for Anglo Welsh and their hire Boats. The far end of the Basin has been drained to repair the towpath and to make way for new utilities to the site. During the draining, fish were carefully transferred back into the main network. It was reported that there were as many fish found in that one small section as they would usually find in a whole kilometre of Canal. Fish are a superb indicator of good water quality. Water quality has improved significantly since the industrial revolution which Trevor Basin is renowned for. The fish will all be back to enjoy this spot again soon.



PKC GROUP UPDATE APRIL 2023



Dear All, we are reopening the Ebenezer as a Climate Crisis Mitigation Centre in May on a permanent basis for our community. We are applying for the significant finance to be able to do this as work is required, to repair, service and maintain much of the equipment in the Ebenezer, such as the roof, heating and lift after 10 years of closure. We have invited both local Community Councils and WCBC to support. The first floor will be given over to the Climate Crisis Mitigation Centre, which will be the main feature. This will have displays ranging from far off locations local scenes we are all familiar with. The general concept is to be Citizen Science led (i.e. us), where we will use available information to show the problems we face and the solutions we can and are putting in place. We will be looking at Fuel Poverty and how this can be resolved on a Low Carbon basis for our community, as well as many other issues, and your input is welcomed. Together we can have a very significant voice. Also, on the first floor we will have a Technical & Earth Science Library that specialises in local history, and we hope to link up with Cefn Museum. If you have any reference books, or books about our local area that you don't want please bring them along for the library. This will be supplemented by a small office set aside for Employment Agency and CAB. In the atrium on the first floor, we will have the Art Gallery we have planned since 2015 where local artists are welcome to display their work. There will be a tourist information point in the entrance foyer where we want to feature local venues, such as all our pubs, B&B's, shops, and facilities including Plas Madoc. So please have a think about what you would like on show and bring along. We also need people, as it will require many people to run this venue successfully and I am afraid in the first year of operations we will all have to work on a voluntary basis, until we get, the commercial aspects of the building working. So if you are interested in helping save our planet, and our community, please let us know. We look forward to hearing from you. If we can secure the funding and large loans being applied for, the building will be made Carbon Zero and put on a commercial basis with a bar, cafe and community cinema opened over the next 18 months as we progress. We estimate that we can achieve a very good head count to the Ebenezer which will help our economy grow on a practical application of Sustainable Tourism Development.
