


CP ISN'T ME by Local Author SAMANTHA MAXWELL

Through her book Samantha Maxwell shares her experiences of living with mild cerebral palsy in the hope of breaking the stigma associated with the disability. Part autobiographical and part factual she aims to show that regardless of ability we are all able and entitled to live a normal live without being penalised for doing so.

She explained: "I have a

degree in graphic design, a graphic design job in the motorsport industry and I own my own small part-time business designing and selling posters online, but because I'm in a wheelchair, that is all society sees unfortunately. In the past, I've been bullied, fired from jobs, and just generally made to feel like an outcast by society just because of my disability." Samantha is currently working on her second book which will be a more of a generalised view of disability through the eyes of society and will have accounts from the likes of the House of Commons and the Disability Liaison Officer at Wrexham AFC.





What happens about shared access & drains if I sell off half my land?

Q:I have run a small market garden business from my home for the last thirty years. I now want to retire but my wife does not want to move out of the house. If I sell off the business and land it occupies, what would I need to do about what would become a shared access road, drains etc? And should I sell it leasehold or freehold?

A: It is becoming more commonplace these days for people with a substantial amount of land to downsize to one part of it, rather than sell up completely and move. However, dealing with shared access roads, drains and other facilities can be tricky, and you should talk through all your options and their implications with a solicitor before making any decisions.

Even if you have it written into the sale contract that your purchaser agrees to carry out repairs, or contribute to repairs that you make, such an obligation will not automatically pass on to someone they later sell the property to. For this to happen, your solicitor will need to draft the documents so that the maintenance obligation applies every time the land is sold on.

Selling the property with a long leasehold interest in the land instead of selling the freehold outright would make it easier to provide for ongoing maintenance obligations. However, if your purchaser needs a mortgage, then a freehold sale is going to be more straightforward and therefore possibly more attractive.

You should also consider how a new neighbour may affect your land in the future, and you may want to restrict how the land you are selling can be used, or what can be built on it. For example, you could limit the number of buildings on the land or restrict their height or position to ensure light to existing buildings is not blocked. The law on rights of light is complex, so this is another very important area to discuss with your solicitor.

LLANGOLLEN MUSEUM NEWS

We are presently waiting with fingers crossed to hear the outcome of first application for funding for the roof repair – which is 'in the final stages of



the decision making process'. A further application for matched funding for the work is in progress. We will also hear by the end of July about funding for another project to increase storage space, improve security and make more images of items in the collection available online.

The exhibition presently on display in the Janet Wakefield Gallery at the Museum consists of a series of photographs, some historical and some modern, depicting scenes from the International Eisteddfod. It has been prepared by the Archive Group at the Eisteddfod to tie in with this year's festival, which was from 4 - 9 July 2023, this exhibition of photographs will run until the end of July.

The *Eisteddfod Archive Committee* have also prepared this month's window display at the Museum.

In August the gallery exhibition will change to one of paintings by the *Llangollen Art Group*.

The talk by former county archaeologist *Fiona Gale* about the restoration work at Ruthin Castle was very well attended and everybody enjoyed finding out about the work that is being done and the history that is being discovered. These are no talks in July and the next presentation will be much earlier in August than usual. Back by popular demand will be *Peter Dickinson*, giving another of his fascinating talks about the age of steam trains. The talk, entitled *Steaming Through North Wales*, is at 7:30pm on **Wednesday 16th August** at the Museum.

Admission will be £3, which includes refreshments. We are quite busy at the moment helping people with *genealogical and house history research*. New displays planned for this year will be one looking at the mills in and around Llangollen and a revamp of our existing display about the geology of the area. Visit our Facebook page



Having the vaccination is very much recommended. In the autumn the vaccination schedule is changing where patients will be given two doses of the vaccine. But making your appointment before September means that you can still have a single vaccination.







Outdoor learning Fun Year 5 thoroughly enjoyed their pond dipping session in our Forest School area. Learners selected appropriate resources and discussed how

best to use them for the purpose of investigating the living creatures in the pond. Learners determined the appropriate safety precautions to take whilst working

alongside the pond. They also discussed how to maintain respect for nature making the following list to support this; appropriate handling of resources, Placing pondweed into the containers as it would contain



wildlife and making sure it was not discarded, ensuring there was appropriate water levels for the creatures we may see, taking care not to be forceful with the equipment to ensure the creatures were safe

Pond water was then carefully scooped up and the containers were placed on the floor ready for observations. Learners carefully investigated the contents of the trays and could see many different types of creatures within the water. Learners used the pond life key diagrams to begin the process of identifying the life observed. Learners carefully



followed the arrows, criteria, descriptions and branches until they found the most appropriate solution. Once they had identified the creatures they

carefully returned the water to the pond, taking care to ensure trays were empty. When they returned to school the children researched on computers to continue identifying their finds.



PKC GROUP UPDATE JULY 2023



The Ebenezer reopened on the 15th of May as the world's first Climate Crisis Mitigation Centre open to the public. This can achieve CO2 Emission Reduction simply by attracting visitors from the aqueduct to also explore our wider community. Something they currently do not do. The current average dwell time is 60 minutes or less, because that's how long it takes to get out of their cars, walk over the aqueduct and back, take a couple of photos, and then drive off elsewhere. In many cases to Llangollen where traffic congestion is one of the main problems Llangollen has during the summer season. This is whilst the streets in Cefn Mawr remain empty.

WCBC has £4.2M to spend in our area over the next 18 months through the levelling up fund and the Government stated that Cefn Mawr should be connected. This in turn has been a driving force in reopening the Ebenezer, to provide a good venue for such and hopefully ensure the right connections can be made. The above map is from the Trevor Basin Master Plan 2017 and as you can see our community / communities are not really included. We need connections that are going to work, to link up our area and end the fragmentation.

To be able to keep the Ebenezer open and bring about economic growth within the retail and hospitality sector of our community we need this connection. One of the main displays in the Ebenezer is about linking our community together to support Sustainable Tourism Development. Given the very high counts at both the Aqueduct and Ty Mawr Country Park, some 400,000 visitors, this is perfectly feasible with the available finance WCBC has from Central Government Levelling Up Fund. Again, we ask WCBC and both Community Councils to join in with us so that we can all work together for the benefit of our community. PS: I have not forgotten about Newbridge and if you call round to the Ebenezer, you will also see this on display as well. Everyone is welcome.
